



TAL Induction Camp

Three-day Induction Camp for Year 7!

At the start of the year, all Year 7 students will take part in the TAL Induction Camp. This three-day event is designed to induct you fully into the TAL way, the systems, routines, and expectations of our academy. Each day will be underpinned by our core values of **Empathy, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility** and is designed to support your successful transition into high school. During TAL Camp, you will meet your Form Tutor, have an opportunity to make new friends and understand your timetable and how to find your way around the school building. We will also give you key equipment and information on our expectations and answer any questions that you may have.

Our four core values are embedded into every Trinity MAT school!

Before you start with us, we will be sending out lots more information around uniform, transport, and online payment systems. We will also be inviting you and your family to our Induction event where we can find out more about you before you start.

The Academy Day

Our school day starts at **8.00am sharp**, this is when the school gates will be shut, and all students should be in the dining room ready for their morning meeting. Arriving after this time will incur a 'late' sanction. If you wish to be on school site earlier than this, **you are welcome to join our Breakfast Club from 7.30am - 8.00am** where a selection of cereals and baked goods will be available.

You will attend **five lessons per day in a range of subjects** and will be given your timetable with classrooms and teachers on your first week with us. You will also be given a Form Group and Tutor and you will take part in daily Drop Everything And Read (D.E.A.R.) sessions. Two of our days, Tuesday and Wednesday, are extended until 3.50pm where you will have the chance to take part in a wide range of co-curricular activities through our programme, Involve.

Any student failing to follow TAL expectations, first time, every time, will be subject to school sanctions that may result in same day detentions. TAL's Positive Behaviour policy is applied consistently by all staff to ensure that no moment of learning time is lost and that every student feels safe. Our complete system of sanctions and rewards will be explained in detail to you during the TAL Induction Camp and you will find a summary of this in your TAL Planner. Your Form Tutor will support you with guidance and reminders during the first few weeks and beyond to help you develop your positive learning habits.

Attendance and Punctuality

At Trinity Academy Leeds, everyone is expected to be on time to school and to lessons. Each day, all students must be in the Dining Hall and be ready to learn with all the equipment they need by 8.00am. You can win Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum award badges, receive certificates and phone calls home and even be invited to reward trips or receive fantastic prizes. The Dining Room

The Dining Room is located on the ground floor in the centre of the academy. This will be the first place that you meet every day for Breakfast Club and then Morning Recall meetings. The Dining Room will also be where you spend your Break and Community Lunch times if you wish to purchase food. You must finish all your food before you use the outside courtyard or courts.

Break is 10.30am - 10.50am

A range of hot and cold healthy snacks and drinks will be available for you to purchase.



Community Lunch is 12.20pm - 12.50pm

You will be able to choose from a range of hot and cold meals, including meal deals, sandwiches, wraps, pasta pots and salads. A full choice of cold drinks, desserts and fruit will also be available.




We try to include a special treat on Fridays!

We call our lunchtime **Community Lunch** as at TAL we all (students and staff) eat lunch together as one big community. This strengthens relationships and keeps the Dining Room a calm and welcoming environment for all.

The Dining Room

At all times TAL students are expected to behave in a calm and respectful manner in the Dining Room and queue sensibly to purchase food. At TAL you will use your **fingerprint to purchase your food electronically** from our tills, this will automatically deduct money from your account. Parents/carers will be emailed full information about how to set up and top up your account including full details about **eligibility for free school meals**. You are welcome to **bring a healthy packed lunch** should you prefer and we recommend that you bring a refillable water bottle (**water only**) to keep you hydrated throughout the day.

Uniform

It is one of our TAL Absolutes that all our students take pride in themselves and their appearance and follow our uniform expectations. A visual guide to our uniform expectations can be found below, a more detailed guide will be included in the Parent/Carer Handbook that will be emailed to all families.

Hair Accessory
You are allowed one plain black hair accessory.

Religious Headwear
Hijabs, scarves, turbans, crowns, and top knots, worn for religious reasons, must be plain.

TAL Tie
Tie should be clipped to top button of your shirt!

School Blazer
The blazer must be worn at all times with sleeves rolled down. We encourage you to wear your TAL pin badges on your blazer!

Shoes
Shoes must be sensible and entirely plain black, worn with plain black socks.

Skirt and Trousers
Tartan skirt with black tights or full-length black tailored (not tight) trousers / shalwar or plain black kameez and tunic.

Uniform

We cannot wait to see you in September looking smart in your new uniform. The correct uniform should be worn at all times within, and on the way to and from, the academy. If you arrive in incorrect uniform, you will be given a sanction and will be expected to borrow an item of clothing so that your learning is not disrupted.

We ask that you do not wear an outside coat unless the weather is poor and that this is removed as soon as you enter the academy. You will also have the option to buy a fine knit grey jumper with the school logo as an extra layer.



Essential Equipment

Being fully equipped is another one of our TAL Absolutes and there are several items that we expect you to bring into school every single day. *You will be given your own TAL equipment bag. You will need to bring a separate bag/rucksack containing your P.E kit on the days that you have P.E, co-curricular and Dance. (This will not be on your first day at the academy). It will also be useful for you to have an English and Spanish dictionary at home.

For your first day at the academy, you should bring the following inside this bag:

A pencil case containing; two black pens, two pencils, eraser, ruler, protractor.

A challenging reading book that can be brought from home or borrowed from the academy library.

*The Build Booklet.

*A Recall Folder containing Knowledge Organisers for each of your subjects.

*Your TAL Student Planner.

You can purchase any missing equipment from the Student Office before 8.00am. Failure to bring the correct equipment will result in a sanction.

***These items will be given to you on your first day with us.**

Home Learning

At the beginning of each year, you will be given a TAL planner. This will contain your timetable, space to record your home learning and a notes section for reminders. Your planner needs to be signed weekly by your Form Tutor and Parent/Carer who will sign off your daily home learning and keep track of your progress. You need to take good care of your planner, if defaced or lost, this will result in a sanction and you will be expected to pay for the cost of a replacement. At TAL home learning is set daily and termly.

Daily home learning consists of three strands:

1 Reading:

You should complete at least 30 minutes of reading each night from your challenging reading book. This can be your own, or one from the school library. You should keep a note of this in your planner.

2 Maths:




You will be set daily homework from the online programme, Hegarty Maths, the number of tasks may vary but should take, in total, approximately 30 minutes. You will be given a username and password to record in your planner.

3 Recall:

You will be given a Recall Folder which will contain the Term's Knowledge Organisers (an A4 sheet with all the key facts that you need to learn) in every subject, numbered by page and sections. Every morning during Morning Recall you will be set part of this folder to learn for your daily home learning using the 'look, cover, check' technique. We will go through exactly how to do this during TAL Induction Camp.

You will be tested half termly through our big quiz, Masters of Recall. See an example of a Knowledge Organiser below:

Shine Projects:

In addition to your standard daily homework, you will be expected to complete an **independent Shine Project each term**. You should spend around 1 hour on your Shine Project each week. Projects are assessed through a student exhibition at the end of each term which your family and teachers will be invited to.



Involve

As well as an exciting range of subjects, we are also keen to offer every student at TAL the opportunity to take part in two co-curricular options each week through our MAT wide programme, Involve. We have two extended days on Tuesday and Wednesday where qualified teaching staff and partners from across the city will give you the option to choose from lots of exciting clubs and co-curricular opportunities.

Involve club options might include:

Futsal, STEM club, Photography, Book Club, Rowing, Catering and Fashion Design. We will be asking you about your interests soon!

Leeds Academy of Performing Arts

Join our LAPA CLUB!

Being a student of TAL means that you have a unique opportunity to be part of **Leeds Academy of Performing Arts (LAPA)** every Thursday from 2.50pm - 4.50pm. This co-curricular experience is designed to develop young people with a love and interest in Musical Theatre and the Performing Arts. This two-hour session is delivered by performance experts and is free of charge. It will cover a range of disciplines including voice, acting and dance and will result in termly showcases with invited audiences. You will have the opportunity to apply for a place through the transition process where you will need to commit to regular attendance and additional rehearsals and show times. Additional LAPA merchandise will be available to purchase through the school and should be worn during attendance.

In addition to our LAPA provision we hope to offer you a range of additional opportunities through the Arts, this includes music tuition, workshops with industry professionals and theatre/studio visits.

The Build

Every student in Year 7 takes part in Level 1 of **The Build** and is challenged with completing 40 key achievements that are underpinned by our MAT core values of Empathy, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility. When you complete one of these activities, you will need to provide evidence to your Form Tutor who will use a 'Build' stamp in your Build Booklet to confirm that it has been met. You will receive a score at the end of the year and take part in an award ceremony recognising your successful completion of the first level of The Build!

40 STEPS TO GET STAMPED



The Build: Level 1

Welcome to Level 1 of The Build! Each year at Trinity Academy Leeds (TAL), you will be challenged to complete a level of the TAL Big Build! You have 40 different steps to complete during Year 7 that will help you grow stronger in body and mind. Every student will receive a score at the end of the year and rewards will be given to all who successfully complete Level 1. Complete 35-40 steps to win gold, 30 steps for silver and 25-30 steps for bronze. We will celebrate your achievement at the end of the year with a special ceremony before starting Level 2. The challenges below are designed to help you adopt positive learning habits and live the TAL core values of Empathy, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility.

We make sure that we reward all students who show excellent effort, behaviour and attitude by awarding Achievement Points which lead to special awards, including academy badges that you can wear on your school blazer with pride.

Lost Property

Please ensure that your uniform/equipment is named; secondary school is a much larger setting and things can go missing very easily if not. All lost property should be handed in at reception. If a student loses any item they should ask at the reception if it has been found. Named items are returned to students via Form Tutors. Items that are not named are placed in lost property. These are held until the end of term.

Phones and Technology

Mobile phones are not allowed in the academy and are only permitted if switched off and placed in bags out of sight. If students need to contact home, they can use the phone in the Student Office at the front of school. Any student found using a mobile phone or smartwatch during the day will have the item confiscated. It will not be returned until the end of term or until a parent comes into school to collect it. The student will also receive a suitable sanction. The academy accepts no responsibility for the safety or security of the above equipment.


