Reformation	The change in the way that people worshipped in Europe in the 16th century.	
catholic	A member of the Roman Catholic Church. They are Christians, led by the Pope.	
protestant	A member of the Christian faith who follows the teachings of the Reformation.

animal welfare	The health and happiness of animals.	
welfare	The health and happiness of a group.	
freedom	Being free to choose your actions.

fieldwork	Gathering information to answer a geographical question.	
deciduous forest	A biome made up of mainly deciduous trees, located at latitudes between 30-60 degrees. An example is the UK.	
landscape	An area of Earth's surface visible from one place.

gentry	Wealthy land-owners.	
hierarchy	A system of ordering people from most to least important.	
nobility	People with wealth and power who held titles such as 'Duke' and 'Lord'. They worked closely with the Queen.	

Religious Studies		
karma	How our actions determine our future.	
precept	A rule on how to behave.	
vegetarian	A person who does not eat meat or fish.	

Geography		
topography	The physical features of the surface (top) of the land.	
landform	An individual feature in a landscape e.g., a hill, mountain, river or beach.	
peak	The highest part of a hill or mountain.	
soil	The material on the surface of the ground that plants grow in.


History

contour line	A thin orange line on an OS map that connects points of equal height.	
spot height	A dot and a number on a map that shows the height of the land.	
rock cycle	A series of processes that continually destroy and create rocks.	See final page.
permeable	A material with holes that allows liquid or gas to pass through.	

History		
The Globe	A famous theatre during the Elizabethan period. Shakespeare's plays were performed here.	
circumnavigate	To travel all the way around something.	
voyage	A long journey involving travel by sea.

slaughter	The killing of animals for food.	
halal	Something that is permissible in Islam.	
haram	Something that is impermissible in Islam.	

Geography		
sediment	Rock pieces	
igneous	Rock formed when molten rock cools and solidifies, e.g. basalt.	
sedimentary	Rock formed when layers of rock particles are compacted within the crust, e.g. limestone and shale.	
metamorphic	Rock formed from heat and pressure e.g. slate.

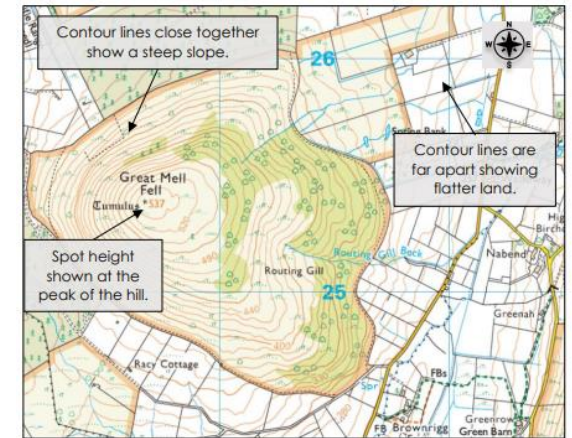
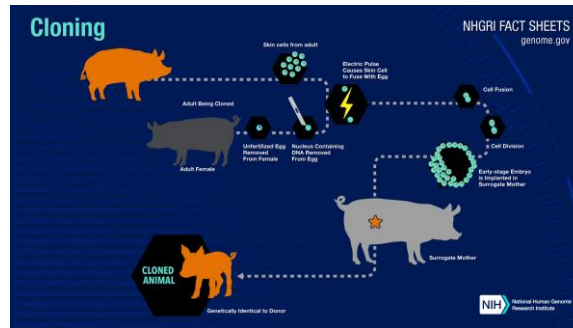


Figure 5 – OS map of Great Mell Fell and surrounding area.
