











Week 1:

<b>(to) abdicate</b>	To give up the throne.	 
<b>combat</b>	To fight.	
<b>military</b>	The armed forces (army, navy and air force).

<b>Five Precepts</b>	Five rules that Buddhists believe remove suffering.	
<b>vegetarian</b>	A person who does not eat meat or fish.	
<b>karma</b>	How our actions determine the future.	

Geography		
<b>climate</b>	The long-term average weather conditions.	
<b>latitude</b>	Degrees of distance north or south of the Equator.	
<b>uninhabitable</b>	A place that is not suitable for humans or animals to live.

History		
<b>Bolsheviks</b>	A communist party led by Lenin. They took control of Russia in October 1917.	
<b>communism</b>	A left-wing political ideology.	
<b>manifesto</b>	A public announcement of aims or policies.	

Religious Studies		
<b>halal</b>	Something that is permissible in Islam.	
<b>haram</b>	Something that is impermissible in Islam.	
<b>slaughter</b>	The killing of animals for food.	

Geography		
<b>Arctic</b>	The land and sea above the Arctic Circle (66°N).	See final page.
<b>Antarctic</b>	The land and sea below the Antarctic Circle (66°S).	
<b>polar</b>	The regions around the North and South poles, within the Arctic and Antarctic circles.

<b>civil war</b>	A conflict which takes place between two or more sides inside of one country.	
<b>Reds</b>	The Bolsheviks who fought in the Russian Civil War.	
<b>Whites</b>	The Tsarist forces who fought in the Russian Civil War.

<b>dominion</b>	The control or power over something.	
<b>Humanism</b>	An atheist worldview focused on leading happy lives.	
<b>stewardship</b>	The religious duty to take care of others.	

Geography		
<b>global</b>	Relating to the whole world.	
<b>ice sheet</b>	A huge mass of land ice, formed from compacted snow.	
<b>regional</b>	An area of a country or of the world.

<b>consequence</b>	Something that happens because of something else.	
<b>interpretation</b>	A historian's view.	
<b>significant</b>	Important.	

Religious Studies		
<b>activist</b>	A person who campaigns to bring about social or political change.	
<b>campaign</b>	A planned group intending to achieve a certain goal.	
<b>RSPCA</b>	A charity in England and Wales which promotes animal welfare.	

Geography		
<b>concentrated</b>	Focused or intense.	See final page.
<b>dispersed</b>	Spread out, e.g. the Sun's energy is dispersed in the high latitudes.	
<b>solar radiation</b>	Heat energy from the sun.

History		
<b>colony</b>	The name for a country being ruled by another country.	
<b>empire</b>	Groups of countries that are governed by one country.	
<b>nationalism</b>	A feeling of strong loyalty or devotion towards your country, sometimes with a negative impact on other countries.

<b>animal welfare</b>	The health and happiness of animals.	
<b>animal experiments</b>	When medical drugs are tested on animals before humans.	
<b>cloning</b>	Creating identical copies of living organisms.	

Geography		
<b>adaptation</b>	When a species slowly changes to survive in the conditions in which it lives.	
<b>camouflage</b>	The ability to blend into surroundings, often to hide from predators or prey.	
<b>hibernate</b>	When a plant or animal is inactive during the winter.	


History		
<b>alliance</b>	A partnership between two or more countries.	
<b>cause</b>	An event which leads to something else happening.	
<b>Militarism</b>	The building up of weapons and armed forces.	

Religious Studies		
<b>moral</b>	A right action.	
<b>immoral</b>	A wrong action.	
<b>Free will</b>	The freedom to choose our actions.	

Geography		
<b>biome</b>	A large ecosystem.	
<b>permafrost</b>	A permanent frozen layer of ice beneath the soil.	
<b>tundra</b>	A cold biome with mainly flat land and very little vegetation.

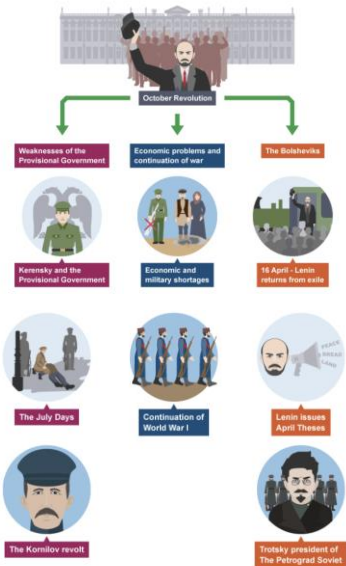

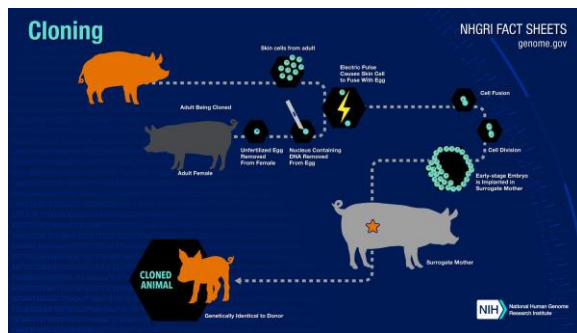

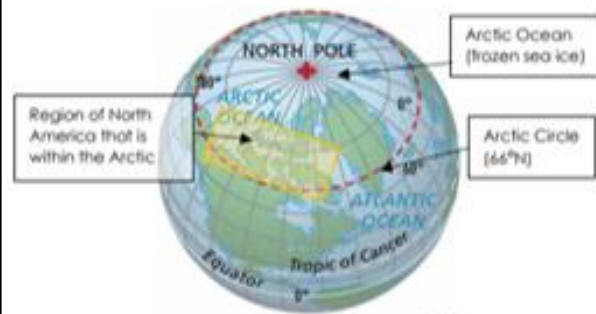

Location of the Antarctic:

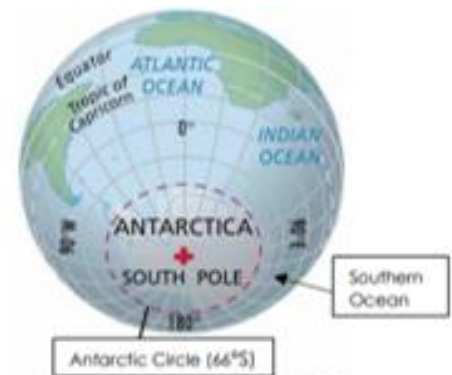


Diagram of global sunlight concentration:
