<b>infinitive verb:</b>	The most basic form of a verb.  In English the infinitive starts with the word 'to'.  <b>Example: to talk</b>

Key term	Definition
<b>conditional future tense:</b>	Expresses an ambition or intention that has not happened yet, but may happen in the future.  <b>Example: When I am older, I <u>would like</u> to study maths.</b>

¿ <b>Qué</b> te gustaría estudiar en el futuro?	<b>What</b> would you like to study in the future?
Me gustaría estudiar español porque me gustaría ser <b>profe</b> .	I would like to study Spanish because I would like to be <b>[a] teacher</b> .
