

Human Rights Act 1998	The rights and freedoms that everyone in the UK is entitled to.

digimaps	An online map program that contains aerial photos and OS maps of the UK.

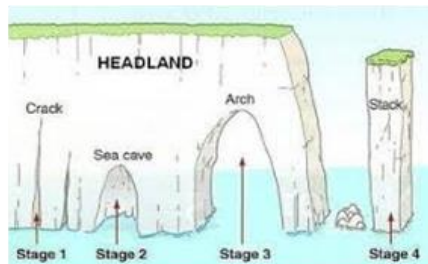
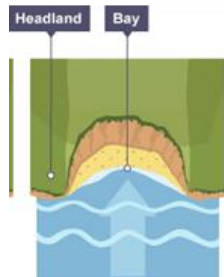

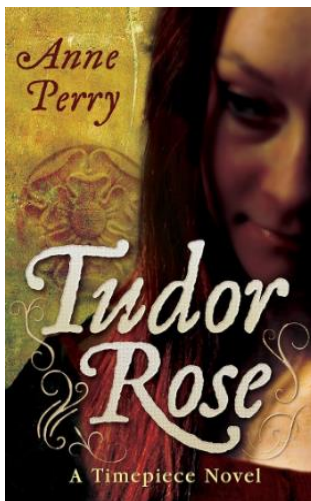

tyrant	A leader who controls using force and not listening to people.

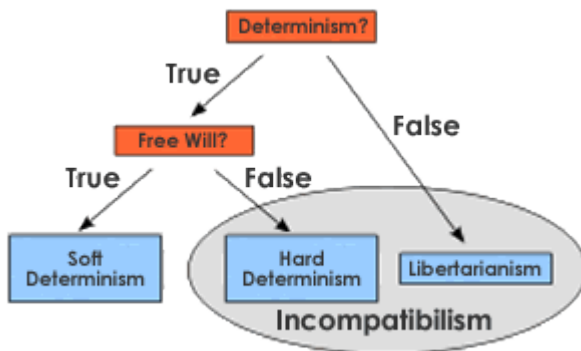
