<b>conjugate:</b>	To change the spelling of an infinitive verb, in order to provide information about who is doing the action and when it is taking place. <b>Example:</b> <b>to play → I played</b>														
<b>present tense:</b>	Refers to actions that are happening right now or happen regularly. <b>Example: I eat rice every day.</b> To conjugate the present tense: 1.
